



New PCUN book series on international psychology

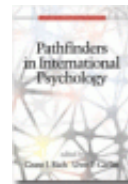

Since 2012, the Psychology Coalition at the United Nations (PCUN)¹ has brought together many psychology experts and student interns, to apply behavioral science to the important work of the United Nations and its 17 Sustainable Development Goals.² PCUN welcomes followers on Facebook,³ Twitter,⁴ Instagram.⁵

In 2020, PCUN voted to launch a bold new book series on International Psychology,⁶ with a distinguished global publisher (Information Age Publishing), where PCUN experts and others can share their insights and research with a diverse global audience—policy makers, university students, and the public. So far, the series has published four books, with more on the way.

- 3. Elaine P. Congress, Dalton Meister, Shenae C. Osborn, & Harold Takooshian (2022). (Eds.). Behavioral science in the global arena: **Global mental, spiritual, and social health**. [14 chapters in 218 pages by 36 co-authors from 5 nations]
- 4. Elaine P. Congress, Dalton Meister, Shenae C. Osborn, & Harold Takooshian (in press). (Eds.). Behavioral science in the global arena: **Health trends and issues**. [14 chapters by 37 co-authors from 7 nations]



Each volume in this series is suitable as a textbook/ reader for diverse psychology courses: Introduction, Applied, Social Issues, Health, Cross-Cultural. Each volume is at low cost (under \$50), and designed with 4 unusual features:

1. **Diversity.** In about 15 concise chapters, 30+ authors from several nations offer a panoramic view of diverse issues among the UN’s 17 “Sustainable Development Goals.”
2. **Simplicity.** Each chapter follows a simple format: a definition and overview of its timely issue, a glossary of key concepts, study questions, and a list of references.
3. **Student-oriented.** By design, most chapters are co-authored by a leading expert in that specialty, teamed with a “rising star” student intern working with the UN—so the volume is suitable as a textbook for novices as well as a reference book for professionals.
4. **Authoritative.** These first-ever volumes on “behavioral science at the UN” are praised as “much-needed” volumes by leaders in the diplomatic and academic communities.
